I know I'm not as energetic as I was a few months ago, but dang it, there's just so much to do and not near enough time nor energy to get it all done.

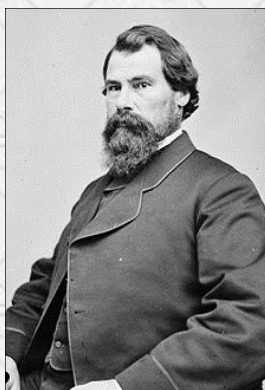

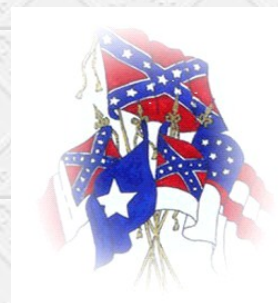

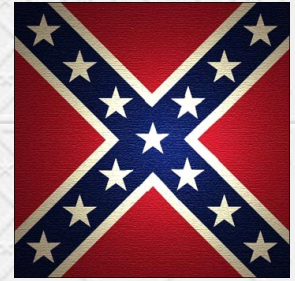


Memorial Plaza Update

We are pleased and excited to announce that what we hope to be the last hurdle before getting back to work on the plaza, was cleared on Tuesday the 21st when Dan Dyer and Gary Williams presented a splendid and well prepared presentation before the Landmark Historical Commission. We were seeking their approval as to the historical appropriateness of our planned memorial. Dan and Gary are to be commended for their excellent presentation and dedication even though our efforts to merely honor our Confederate heritage were once again slandered and maligned by the same parties and hate group that we dealt with in April 2011.

We were pleased with the unanimous decision of the Landmark Commissioners to grant their blessing to our project, much to the humiliation and disdain of the aforementioned un-named well known hate group.

Our next step will be to secure the necessary permits from the city and issue a press release to the local media and various CS related magazines offering pavers to the public and announcing our planned opening/dedication date early next spring. 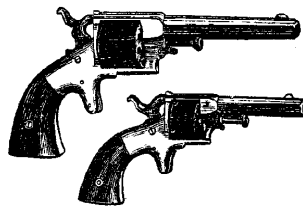

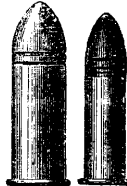

The citizen-soldiers who fought for the Confederacy personified the best qualities of America. The preservation of liberty and freedom was the motivating factor in the South's decision to fight the *Second American Revolution*. The tenacity with which Confederate soldiers fought underscored their belief in the rights guaranteed by the Constitution. These attributes are the underpinning of our democratic society and represent the foundation on which this nation was built.

Today, the **Sons of Confederate Veterans** is preserving the history and legacy of these heroes, so future generations can understand the motives that animated the Southern Cause.

The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans, and the oldest hereditary organization for male descendants of Confederate soldiers. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved.

Membership in the **Sons of Confederate Veterans** is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces. Membership can be obtained through either **lineal or collateral** family lines and kinship to a veteran must be **documented genealogically**. The minimum age for full membership is 12, but there is no minimum for Cadet membership. **Friends of the SCV** memberships are available as well to those who are committed to upholding our charge, but do not have the
