

<u>Dual grave marker ceremonies September 29th at the Matthews and Sheridan Cemeteries in Houston</u> <u>County</u>

We will begin at the Matthews Cemetery, service starts at 11 AM so we need to be on site no later than 9:30 - 10 AM, earlier is better. We will need the cannon and muskets for this one, but sad to say, the property owner won't let us fire anything at the Sheridan Cemetery for fear of fire and "scaring his dogs." Yup, I see that look on your face from here, but that's what the noodle head said to Miss Dollye. Now how do you get there? Head for Grapeland on Hwy 287 and take the Business 287 turn that will run you into downtown Grapeland. At the flashing caution light downtown, turn right onto FM 227 and cross the RR Tracks. Three blocks down on 227 you'll see the 1st Baptist Church on your right. That's FM 1272. Turn right onto FM 1272 and go 7.6 miles on Fm 1272 looking for the Antrim Cemetery sign on the right side of 1272. Along the way, resist the urge to veer off 1272 at several misleading spots. The Antrim cemetery sign is at 1272 and CR 2290. Turn right at Antrim Cemetery sign/CR 2290, go .9 miles and look for sign on your right directing you into Matthews Cemetery. We'll have a few of our signs along the way so don't panic. The second ceremony is only about two miles back up the road from the first. Go back to 1272, turn left and go .5 miles to CR 2235 and turn right at the Historical Marker sign. Follow 2235 for 1.7 miles, you'll be at a tight left hand curve in the road and the old Sheridan home place is on the right in that curve. Again there'll be a sign there to let you know where to park, etc. There will be restroom facilities at the Matthews Cemetery but none at the Sheridan Cemetery.

<u>Safety tips</u>; bring plenty of water, maybe something to repel ticks and chiggers, and keep your eyes open for snakes at both places. I'll bring some black pepper for noodle head's dogs.

The citizen-soldiers who fought for the Confederacy personified the best qualities of America. The preservation of liberty and freedom was the motivating factor in the South's decision to fight the *Second American Revolution*. The tenacity with which Confederate soldiers fought underscored their belief in the rights guaranteed by the Constitution. These attributes are the underpinning of our democratic society and represent the foundation on which this nation was built.

Today, the **Sons of Confederate Veterans** is preserving the history and legacy of these heroes, so future generations can understand the motives that animated the Southern Cause.

The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans, and the oldest hereditary organization for male descendents of Confederate soldiers. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved.

Membership in the **Sons of Confederate Veterans** is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces. Membership can be obtained through either **lineal or collateral** family lines and kinship to a veteran must be **documented genealogically**. The minimum age for full membership is 12, but there is no minimum for Cadet membership. **Friends of the SCV** memberships are available as well to those who are committed to upholding our charge, but do not have the
